Background: The Housing and Workforce Solutions (HWS) Department on behalf of the Riverside County Continuum of Care opened an RFP for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care Supplemental to Address Unsheltered Homelessness Competition on August 30, 2022. The purpose of the program is to target efforts to reduce unsheltered homelessness, particularly in communities with very high levels of

unsheltered homelessness and homelessness in rural areas. HUD will award funding to communities to implement coordinated approaches -- grounded in Housing First and public health principles – to reduce the prevalence of unsheltered homelessness, and improve services engagement, health outcomes, and housing stability among highly vulnerable unsheltered individuals and families. HUD expects applicant communities to partner with health and housing agencies to leverage mainstream housing and healthcare resources.

The Riverside County Continuum of Care is making available up to \$13,724,977 as part of the 2022 Supplemental Funding Opportunity to Address Unsheltered Homelessness Application to aid under the following components:

- 1. For Permanent Housing Projects:
 - a. New Permanent Supportive Housing (PH-PSH)
 - b. Project New Permanent Housing-Rapid Re-Housing (PH-RRH)
- 2. Supportive Services Only Projects- Coordinated Entry
- 3. Supportive Services Only Projects- Non-Coordinated Entry (SSO-Street Outreach and SSO other)
- 4. Joint TH and PH-RRH projects
- 5. Planning Set-Aside (additional 3% of total allocation)

The RFP closed on September 20, 2022. HWS received 9 eligible applications totaling \$19,814,921.31 which were reviewed by the CoC's Independent Review Panel (IRP) on September 26th – October 3rd. The CoC worked alongside the IRP to finalize the following funding recommendations below.
