



SUCCESS STORY



Tommie Drake has experienced homelessness several times throughout his life, starting in 2009. Struggles with addiction and substance use had proved to be a major challenge for Tommie, resulting in many unstable housing situations throughout the years. Between 2018 and 2020 Tommie had rented several rooms for varying lengths of time but would routinely find himself experiencing homelessness again and again.

After years of limited success, Mr. Drake became determined to change his life and work towards stability. He sought services at a behavioral health clinic and was ultimately referred to the HHOPE/Mainstream program through Riverside University Health System – Behavioral Health Department. Tommie was connected to caring and dedicated staff, who worked to address the various hardships Tommie was experiencing.



SUCCESS STORY

On December 23th, 2020, Tommie's dreams became a reality: He had the keys to his own apartment. The RUHS-BH HHOPE team not only assisted with the acquisition of Tommie's new home, but was able to help Tommie Drake move in. The HHOPE team was able to coordinate furnishings for the apartment and even donated a Christmas tree to Tommie on Christmas Eve, giving Tommie a true sense of home.





Tommie Drake's efforts to improve his life are still ongoing. Tommie attends a variety of support groups on a weekly basis, attends his medical appointments every month without being late, and still communicates with the HHOPE staff that had helped him through his time of need. Tommie is now able to spend time pursuing his artistic hobbies, creating both sketches and digital art. After months of hard work, this talented man is now able to shine.

A critical component of the City of Corona's Homeless Strategic Plan is affordable housing. The Department of Housing, Homelessness Prevention & Workforce Solutions - Community Solutions Division manages the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) programs, along with several different programs that result in the development and preservation of affordable housing throughout the County of Riverside. Currently the Division has more than 800 units under construction and has identified more than 5,000 additional units for predevelopment. Creating affordable is an essential focus in our region because it provides our most vulnerable community members, such as those experiencing homelessness a place to call home. The presentation will include an engaged discussion on forthcoming projects and ways future federal, state, and local funding can be leveraged to launch additional innovative approaches to end homelessness.
